Lands of Solutions against Plastic Pollution

The Mediterranean is particularly impacted by plastic pollution.

With 1 to 10 million plastic particles per square kilometre, it is probably the most polluted sea in the world. These concerns are **even more worrying on island sites**, limited in their space and with often large quantities of plastics waste and insufficient resources to set up complete sorting and recycling channels.

Nevertheless, **small islands remain resilient territories**. Striving to propose solutions, from reduction to recycling, they are **leaders of change**. In order to have a long-term impact on marine waste reduction, **the results of these solutions must be capitalised and shared**.

That is the aim of the BeMed-Islands capitalisation process and of this meeting.
